# **Beautiful Warrior**

# Introduce Vocabulary Strategy

BUILD WORD POWER Connect students' experiences to the major theme

of the book, concentration. Explain to students that many things in life require concentration. For example, when baseball players are batting, they must have total concentration on the ball. In other words, concentration means "focus" or "close attention." Ask the students to name some activities they do that require concentration. Remind them that this ability will be a major theme in the book they are about to listen to.

Explain how to use context clues to figure out the meaning of an unfamiliar word like concentration. For example, in the book you'll be reading, Mingyi is taught how to keep her concentration. Show students that they can use the words that surround concentration—like "staying on the poles took so much concentration Mingyi forgot to complain"—to help them understand the word's meaning.

#### HIGHLIGHT CONTEXT CLUES Coach students to use context clues to

understand the meanings of nouns. Remind students that nouns are words that name persons, places, things, or ideas. Create a sentence with a noun and context clues, such as A famous singer gave a donation of \$5000 to buy uniforms for our band. Use a chart with the headings "Noun," "Clues," and "Meaning." Fill in the columns of the chart. Have students supply more sentences that use context as clues to support the meaning of nouns, and add to the chart. Then, connect this strategy to the story by reminding students that as they listen to the kung fu legend they will find themselves using context clues to understand some important nouns.
