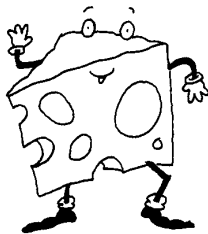


DO YOU KNOW YOUR IDIOMS?

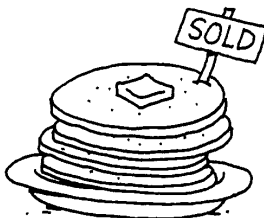
