

Workshop 5: Wired for Trouble**Reading 2 Project: Cyberbullies**
Design a Web Page

Everything you need to know to stop bullies—in cyberspace!

Project: Work with a partner to design an informative web page about cyberbullies.

Procedure

1. **Brainstorm ideas.** With your partner, think about what information to include on your web page. Here are some questions to get you started:
 - What is your definition of a cyberbully?
 - How do cyberbullies use technology to hurt other people?

Write a few questions of your own.

2. **Plan your web page.** Use the Internet to explore informational web sites for teens. Use a search engine and type “teens against drunk driving” or another topic that interests you. Use the home page of a web site you like as a model.
 - How is the web page organized?
 - How does the web page use photos or charts?
 - What kinds of links does the web page have?

Make notes about what you want to include on your web page.

3. **Create a rough draft.** Sketch a draft of your web page. Mark the areas where you want titles, photos, graphics, text, and links. Then write and print your text. Download or create your own illustrations.
4. **Present your work.** Take turns proofreading your work. Make corrections. Then paste your titles, text, and illustrations onto posterboard, following the design of your draft. Display your home page to the class.
