Project: Work with a partner. Help others learn about child labor. Create a poster for other students to see.

Procedure**1. Brainstorm ideas.**

What do you want students to know about child labor? Jot down ideas about these questions to get you thinking:

- Why is child labor a problem?
- Are many children affected by child labor?
- What are their lives like?
- What are some products that are made using child labor?
- What can people do to help end unfair child labor practices?

You can use some of these ideas, or come up with your own.

2. Gather information.

Find facts you want to use from the Anchor Video or your *rBook*. You can also go to the library or use the Internet to get more information. Take notes.

3. Plan your layout.

What will the headline say? How will you display facts? Draw or find pictures to include. Sketch out some ideas. It may take several tries.

4. Present your poster.

Put it all together on a piece of poster board. Use markers, your best handwriting, and pictures to grab people's attention. Display your poster in the hallway or school cafeteria.
