

Workshop 4: Stolen Childhoods**Quick Project****Where Was It Made?**

You know that child labor is a serious issue. But you might be surprised to find out how much it affects your daily life.

Project: Read a label. Then do research to find out if child labor might have been involved in making that item.

Procedure**1. Read the label.**

Read the label on something you are wearing or have with you. It might be your shoes, your shirt, your backpack, or some other item. Write answers to these questions:

- What is the item?
- Where was the item made?
- What company made it?

2. Search the Web.

Do an online search to find out if child labor could have been involved.

- Use search terms such as: “child labor” and “India.” Use the name of the country on your label. You can also include the brand name. Be sure to use quotation marks to keep your search focused.

3. Take notes.

Write down notes about what you learned.

- What item did you research?
- In what country was it made?
- Is child labor an issue in this country?
- What did you find out about this company and the issue of child labor?
- Can you tell if child labor was involved in making this item?

4. Present your findings.

Report to the class what you learned. Use your notes to help you.
