

Workshop 9: The Streets of Harlem**Quick Project****Hot Spots Map**

During the Harlem Renaissance, the neighborhood buzzed with exciting hot spots. Where are the hot spots in your neighborhood?

Project: Create a map of your favorite hot spots in your neighborhood.

Procedure**1. Brainstorm a list of neighborhood hot spots.**

A hot spot is a fun and exciting place to be.

- What are the hot spots where you live?
- Choose spots that are most interesting to you. It may be a friend's house, a park where you like to hang out, your own backyard, or somewhere else.

2. Map your hot spots.

Sketch a map with the locations of two or more of your hot spots. You may use the map on page 218 of your *rBook* as a guide.

- Draw the main roads that show how to get to the hot spot. If you're unsure about the exact street names, give it your best guess.
- Include basic landmarks like the mall, your school, and so on. These places will help people who read your map know where things are.
- You may wish to use a map of your neighborhood, city, or town to help you.

3. Present your work.

Use colored pencils to create your final hot spots map. Choose one color to highlight all the hot spots so they really stand out. Add a clever title. Hang up your map and share it with the class.
