

Workshop 3: Bud, Not Buddy**Reading 1 Project: Bud's Breakfast**
Story Captions

Words and pictures can work together to tell a story.

Project: Write a caption for each illustration in "Bud's Breakfast."

Procedure**1. Study the illustrations.**

Review "Bud's Breakfast," beginning on page 60 of your *rBook*. Look at the pictures. Are people talking? Is something dramatic happening? What might the characters be thinking or feeling?

2. Write the captions.

Experiment with different types of captions. Here are some suggestions:

- Point out an interesting detail about the setting.
- Write words that the people in the picture might be saying.
- Get inside a character's mind. Write what he or she is thinking or feeling.

3. Present your work.

Ask if you can write your captions right in the book. If not, write your captions neatly on a piece of paper with the page numbers clearly marked.

As your teacher displays each illustration, take turns with your classmates reading your captions.
