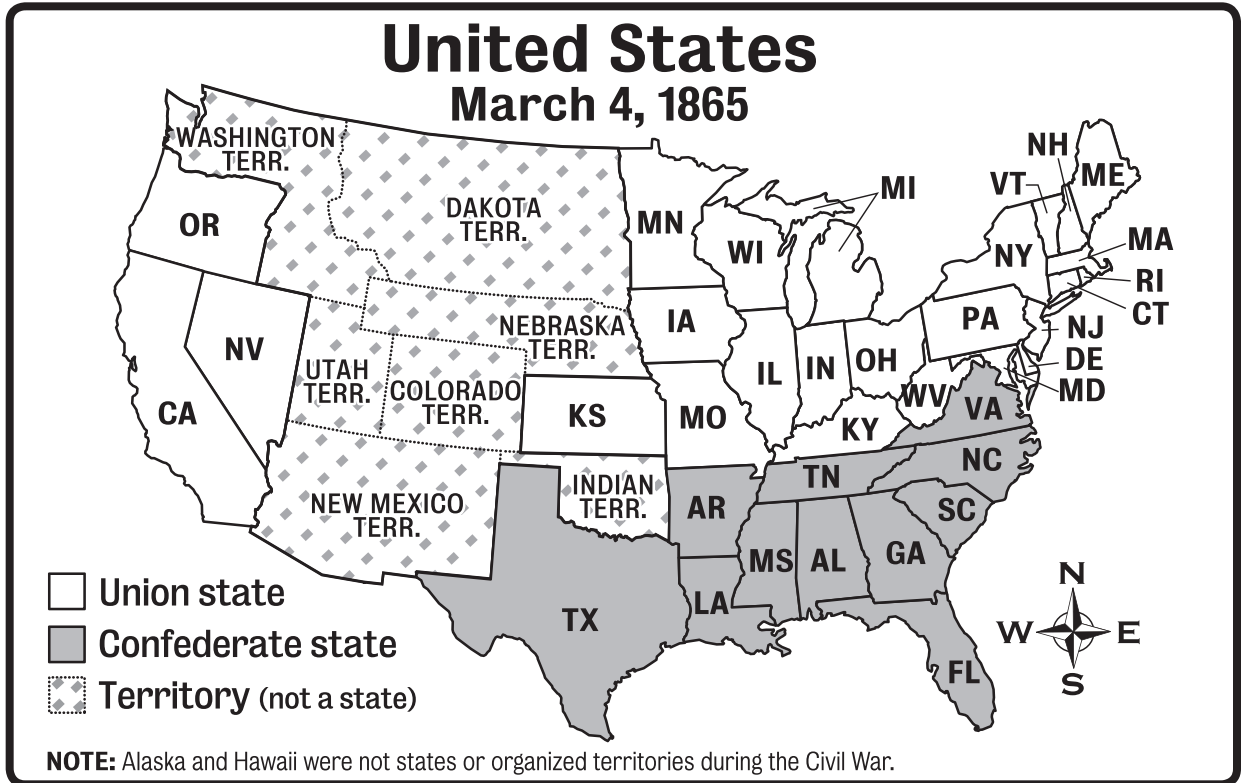

Civil War Map

The Civil War (1861–1865) is often described as a war between the North and the South. By early 1861, several Southern states had broken off from the U.S. and formed what they called the Confederacy. The Northern states were known as the Union. The map below shows these divisions, as well as territories that had not yet become states.
