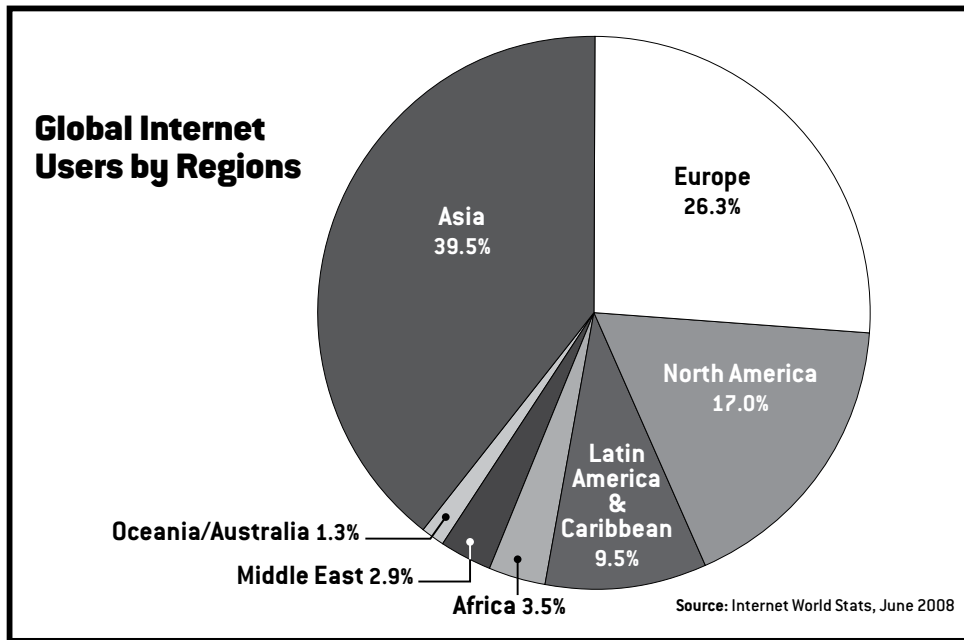


READING A PIE CHART
