

Counting Coins

I counted pennies, "1, 2, 3, 4" to 100, one by one. "I know more ways to count," said Ruth. "In fact, I know a ton!" She counted my pennies, "2, 4, 6, 8," up to 100 by 2's. "Counting this way is great," she said. "You will never lose!"

I counted, "5, 10, 15, 20." Yes, I counted up by 5. And at 100 pennies, I quickly did arrive. Ruthie took back my pennies and counted them by 10 —"10, 20, 30, 40," up to 100 once again!

So count pennies by 1's, 2's, 5's, or 10's — any way you pick.

It's not hard to remember. There is no special trick! Count them by yourself, or count them with a friend — If you have one dollar's worth, you'll reach 100 in the end!
