

ID TRADE BOOKS

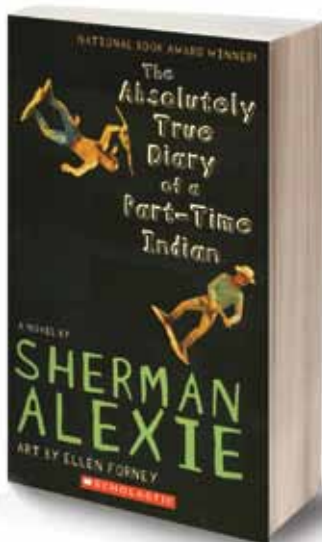

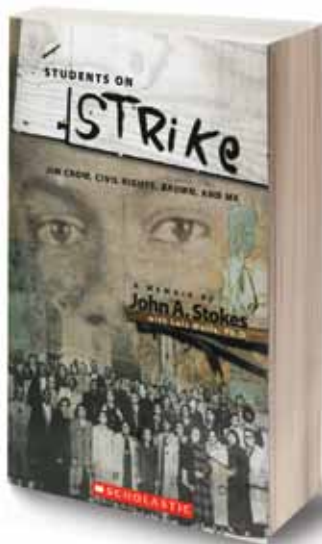
▶ **THE BOY WHO DARED**

In this novel based on actual events, a young man in Nazi Germany risks everything to stand up and speak out against Hitler's regime.



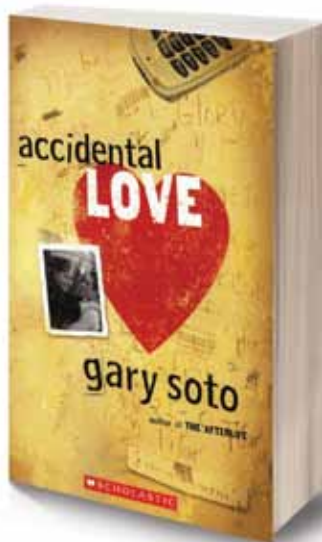
▶ **SELECTED POEMS FROM THE ROSE THAT GREW FROM CONCRETE**

Stokes tells his own story – first as a recipient of “separate but equal” schooling and then as a plaintiff in the landmark Brown v. Board of Education case.



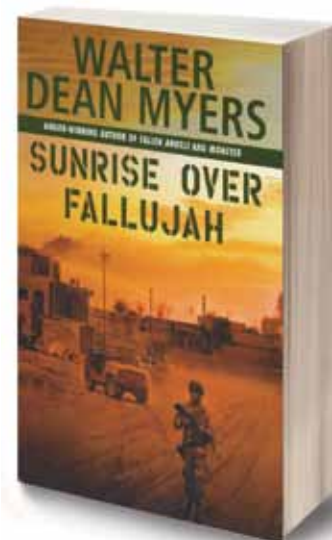
▶ **ACCIDENTAL LOVE**
